The father is unemployed and the couple were struggling to cope both physically and financially. The family live on the 4th floor of high rise building, unable to hang washing outside to dry, wet clothing hanging all over the small flat causing dampness and condensation within the home.

The family are in needed a tumble drier to help ease their stressful situation. We supplied a new one to allow the children to go to school daily with clean clothes.

We are working directly with the vulnerable, providing food vouchers and funding to top up and help those in need.

Understanding Glasgow

“Poverty is a complex and dynamic phenomenon that can be defined in many different ways. However, most definitions would mention the contribution of a range of inter-related elements such as low income, unemployment, lack of opportunity, social exclusion and deprivation - both relative and absolute.



Glasgow remains the most deprived city and local authority area in Scotland. Almost half (47%) of Glasgow's residents, 292,000 people, reside in the 20% of most deprived areas in Scotland. In contrast, nearly 27,000 people (4.4% of the population) live in the 10% of least deprived areas in Scotland (based on 2017 population estimates).

Please help us to lift as many Glasgow citizens out of poverty as we can, even a small donation of £10-£20 makes a huge difference.
